

Sandra Reid

From 1964 to 1968 Sandra Reid (Alexandra Tynan) was employed by the BBC as a Costume Designer for light entertainment, period and modern drama productions. Among her most notable works were the Mark I and Mark II designs for the Cybermen in 'Doctor Who'.

Arriving in Australia in 1968, she worked as a lecturer in Costume, Fashion and Textiles. she later became a freelance designer for film, stage and television productions; her principal credits being for the Australian Broadcasting Corporation in a number of international co-productions.

David Banks

British actor David Banks has appeared in many television roles including East Enders and Brookside. Primarily though, he was known as the Cyberleader in the science fiction series Doctor Who. Appearing in several of the later episodes featuring the Cybermen, *Earthshock* (1982), *The Five Doctors* (1983), *Attack of the Cybermen* (1985), and *Silver Nemesis* (1988), he also played the part of 'Karl the mercenary' in the stage play *Doctor Who - The Ultimate Adventure* (1989) except for two performances when he appeared as The Doctor replacing Jon Pertwee who had fallen ill.

David Banks also wrote *Iceberg* for the Virgin New Adventures range of Doctor Who spin-off novels; it unsurprisingly featured the Cybermen. In 1988 he wrote a biographical work *Doctor Who - Cybermen*. He adapted the book into four audio cassettes which he narrated, *Origins of the Cybermen* (1989, released on CD in 2004), *The Early Cybermen* (1989), *The Cyber Nomads* (1990) and *The Ultimate Cybermen* (1990). K-9 Adventures

Spoiler Free News

Following on the heels of the adult *Torchwood* and adolescent *Sarah Jane Adventures* comes the children's *K9 Adventures*. The basic premise for this young audience does not overly tax the mind. K9 will defend a colonising space ship on their journey to various asteroids, after he is discovered guarding an abandoned prison transport ship (possibly battle cruiser) during the pilot. Simple, but then again the best stories often emerge from a less-is-more background. Interestingly enough, this should screen in Australia (later this year) before last years series of *Sarah Jane Adventures*. The owners of Jetix Europe and the Walt Disney Corporation also plan to make this comedy available for mobile phone downloads - the first for a Doctor Who series.



K9 Adventures, however, is not a BBC production. This means that there will be no Daleks, Cybermen, or other familiar foes. Even John Leeson, the original voice for K9, remains out of the production. The new voice will be much faster, possibly completely different from what fans would expect. To match the voice, K9 will have a new look, making him Mark VI. Still, the creator of the character and the write for this series, Bob Baker, will keep the original feeling and overall meaning of the origins intact.


The twenty-six half-hour episodes will feature CGI mixed seamlessly with live-action creating a realistic feel and providing potential to fulfill the wonderful universe the Bob Barker will have penned. The first episode, the pilot, currently is passing through the hands of Pay-TV companies around the world. The full series will begin shooting after the conclusion of broadcast contract negotiation.

As for the official synopsis, the rest of this news comes from a Park Entertainment press-release. Some of it differs slightly from what I mentioned above as they come from different sources.

The Doctor's favorite companion returns in his own live action and CGI series. Somewhere in the future "The Platte", a Prairie class spacecraft once used for the colonisation of Asteroids, is drifting towards distant stars. On board are Slocum and Djinn.

Slocum - mid-thirties, rugged, taciturn who thinks of himself as a dealer in valuable commodities - others would say he just collects junk! He is a loner – a space gypsy! It's the only way he knows. He's in no hurry to get anywhere and he stays well off the beaten track.

Djinn - a V997 (F), an overactive computer module in the shape of an attractive young woman. She was programmed by the ship's previous owners to provide stimulating conversation. Something that Slocum would happily change if only he had knowledge of her operating codes!





The Doctor and Martha arrive in the American West of 1880 ... not the "wild west" as that time came later, but this turned out wild enough. Alvin Godlove's Travelling Medicine Show is more than just fake remedies, he and his Pawnee Indian assistant, Walking Crow, have stumbled upon something that can cure even smallpox ... making him a healer" of great reputation. But after they have moved on, two sinister "outlaw" types arrive in pursuit of Alvin, leaving a trail of destruction behind them.

I chose to read this one because it has been a long time since the Doctor had a western adventure. Perhaps I was expecting too much? While the story compelled me to see how it all would end, I found that I was never strongly engaged with any of the characters.


Overall, I think that it could have been a lot stronger both in execution and concept and should have at least had one familiar historical figure to give it a kick and a sense of reality. As it was it seemed to float above believability like a cloud of dust from a passing stage-coach ... though I did love page 127 where the Doctor was recognised as "...Rides In Night, Brother of Coyote who defeated the Bad Wolf...".


Rating: 6 out of 10 all a bit pale and dusty!

Hey there again Captain Jack (the Alternate DWCV Universe version) here again! Not only covering the impressive second season of **Torchwood** ... but just in time to preview the first episode of **Doctor Who** series 4 as it goes to air in the UK!

Doctor Who:

4.1 ~ Partners In Crime

First thing I noticed was that the theme music has changed again ... but I don't like this version as much as the previous one , leave it alone! This is one of those episodes that can be brilliant and dreadful at the same time! On first viewing I was thrilled with the story of Donna's reconnection to the Doctor but found the "monsters" to be so silly that they were, like the Slitheen, only fit for The Sarah Jane Adventures, not Doctor Who. Some wacky spy game with a Close Encounters style space ship. Probably the silliest episode I have seen in a very long time but a great ending. I am thrilled that Donna is back... and I NEVER thought I would say that! Thank god the next episode "The Fires Of Pompeii" will be a more traditional, quality one. Rating: 8 out of 10 ... From fart jokes to fat jokes!

Confidential 4.1 ~ A Noble Return

This excellent Confidential covers a lot of the read through for the episode. Also about how the Doctor and Donna keep just missing each other, filming scenes with the window cleaners' cradle, replacing Donna's dad (the actor died) with her grandad (Bernard Cribbins), and filming the key scenes with Donna and her grandad. The how and why of the new Antipose monsters and animating them. The nanny and finally the grandadd's excitement at Donna's freedom. Features interviews and comments from David Tennant, Catherine Tate, Russell T Davies, Phil Collinson, James Strong (Director), Tom Lucy (Stunt Co-ordinator), Andy Pryor (Casting Director), Jacqueline King (Sylvia Noble), Sarah Lancashire (Miss Foster), Tim Bouter (Visual Effects Supervisor). Rating: 10 out of 10 Brilliant!

Series 4 Launch Promotions ~ 2 &4 April2008

As always, there was an avalanche of promotion on TV and Radio for the launch of Series 4 of Doctor Who in the UK. The "kindness of strangers" has made it possible to see many of these interviews and stories. They include: BBC Breakfast, GMTV, Wales Today, BBC News, Newsround Morning and Afternoon, Friday Night with Jonathan Ross, interviews on Radio 1 and Radio 5, as well as the Press Launch, the Season 4 Cinema Trailer, the Dalek Teaser, the Sontaran Teaser and the Ood Teaser. As well as an hilarious Partners In Crime Skit that gives both Donna and Rose a really hard time! *DO NOT* watch these until you have seen episode 4.1 as they spoil a lot of the surprises and best bits! *Oh what a circus, oh what a show!*

Torchwood:

2.1 ~ Kiss, Kiss, Bong, Bang.

Six months after Jack disappeared we return to an outrageous car chase between the remaining Torchwood team and a Blowfish. Jack's back and then another Time Agent, Captain John Hart, played by James Masters, comes along to mess things up for them all. The team has changed, grown up and grown closer. A bar room brawl reunites the two Time Agents and away they go on an action and drama filled episode that leaves us with more questions. High emotions. It is good to see that lanto is a fuller character now, not just the "eye candy". Does he have his own action figure yet? On first viewing it was difficult to appreciate ... different and a bit too gay (even for me) but on second viewing a few weeks later it was excellent! Season 2 Preview trailer was at the end of this episode! Rating: 9 out of 10.



Also comments form all the cast about the whole of season 2.

Torchwood (Continued):

2.2 ~ Sleeper.

Alien murder mystery ... the enemy has been brought inside. Just when you think they have stopped it they start coming out of the wood work. Some brilliant scenes including the explosion of a building. Turns into a 21st Century version of an outdoors action adventure sequence reminiscent of the 3rd Doctor/UNIT days. Ianto has become the clown and smart ass of the team. *Rating: 9 out of 10.*

Declassified 2.2 (13 mins)

About filming the explosions and their conflict with the Glasgow Airport suicide bombing and the resulting bad press reaction. Also about Gwen's response to the human side of the situation with Beth. Features interviews with John Barrowman, Eve Myles (Gwen), Colin Teague (Director), Russell T Davies, Richard Stokes (Producer), James Moran (Writer), Danny Hargreaves (Special Effects), Nicki Amuka-Bird (Beth). Rating: 8 out of 10.

2.3 ~ To The Last Man.

Torchwood 1918 meets Torchwood 2008. About Tosh and Tommy, who "visits" them once a year until they need him ... and this is the year they need him. Ghosts and time shifts that threaten the entire world. We learn some details on one of the previous Torchwood teams. A very moving, interesting, excellent episode. So very, very sad. Tommy, in particular, is amazing. This is the first episode this season to really convince me that a second series of Torchwood was justified. Even better the second time around. Brilliant story, brilliant performances, brilliantly directed. *Rating: 10 out of 10.*

Declassified 2.3 (9 mins)

About Tosh and Tommy. Features interviews with John Barrowman, Naoko Mori (Tosh), Anthony Lewis (Tommy), Andy Goddard (Director), Russell T Davies, Chris Chibnall (Producer), and Helen Raynor (Writer). *Rating:* 9 out of 10.

2.4 ~ Meat.

This is a story that features Rhys and his business gets dragged into a Torchwood investigation involving the harvesting of alien meat. A major point of change for the relationship between Gwen and Rhys as well as growing tensions between Tosh and Owen and also Gwen and Jack. Overall a bit of a gross episode that I would not choose to watch again, but it does have a really good point to it!. *Rating: 7 out of 10.*

Declassified 2.4 (10 mins)

About creating and filming the monster, filming with Rhys in the Hub and with the beast, and about the relationship between him and Gwen. Features interviews with John Barrowman, Kai Owen (Rhys), Colin Teague (Director), Russell T Davies, Richard Stokes (Producer), and Barney Curnow (Visual Effects). *Rating: 8 out of 10.*

2.5 ~ Adam.

Even the opening credits looked a bit wrong. Everyone is acting/looking a bit strange ... Owen and Tosh have swapped personalities, Gwen has forgotten Rhys, lanto goes psycho. Jack starts seeing visions of someone important from his past, then we seajack's childhood in 51st century and a major trauma from that time. Some amazing performances. On most, well I say most, on some discs already released, the restoration team included hidden extras, known by the masses (that would be you) as Easter Eggs. Now some of these are quality Swiss-chocolate shells, while others are a little pointless novelties that are a tad too sweet and ultimately unsatisfying. This guide shall focus on the former, but for those who like test cards, countdown clocks, clean titles, and other ways to not have a life – fear not. When the revamped DWCV website gets launched, a comprehensive guide shall be published in the Archive 6 wing. Please note that most of these Easter Eggs are played by pressing select or enter on a hidden Doctor Who logo which, when revealed, becomes green. For the ease of location, the titles listed below follow story order.

On *Lost in Time*, Fraser Hines introduces *The Underwater Menace* in a hidden feature on the main menu on the second disc. When those rotating circles near Patrick Troughton's head freeze while accompanied by a sound, press the up arrow and highlight the logo. I feel this ought not to have been hidden and instead actually used for the placing of the missing episodes themselves. The narration both feels concise, yet comprehensive. For point of interest, I believe this Egg alone uses the time -delay on its reveal.

A fun extra on the second disc of *The Dalek Invasion of Earth* involves a Dalek called Sid. Well, less of a Dalek and more of a mutant trying to meet the world, or failing that a girl. Press left on the Talking Dalek's title to find the clip. Press left also on the Photo Gallery for a second clip called Sid's Date. Both of these amazingly short clips are both silly and pointless, though for some reason defying justification they are worth watching. Just do not expect anything state of the art as the budget for this must have limited itself to the coins under the sofa cushion.

A nice inclusion of some VidFIRE test footage can be located on *The Tomb of the Cybermen*. Highlight the logo by pressing up from Play All (also a separate, dull egg). A Cyber logo shall appear by pressing right. Press right twice more and the logo copies, so go left afterwards until a circle appears. Watching the test footage, in theory you should notice all the faults, clicks, fuzz, scratches and so on; however, the clip they use with the Doctor talking in regards to his family distracts due to its quality content! Additionally, a trailer from the *Abominable Snowmen* Audio can be found by pressing left on the Audio Options. The audio trailer is quite nice too, though nothing to write home about, or to mention in a reputable publication.

A just-long-enough peak on the recording of the commentary for *The Seeds of Death* can be found by pressing left on Tardis Cam No 5 (disc two). I really do feel it's a pity that they do not show the audio commentaries always like this. I guess it simply would take up too much disc space, but it truly draws you in, allowing you to feel part of the experience. I hope they keep these up, though I find it unlikely. They did do some for the new series, though these were just on-line for the annual advent calendars. Still, the restoration team usually put in some photographs in the Gallery section, but it does not feel the same.

A little bonus I quite liked can be revealed on *Spearhead from Space*. Unused titles for the third Doctor can be shown through the pressing of left while on Play All. The style, while not drastically different, still proves interesting with little glimpses of what might have prevailed. The Doctor with up-stretched arms seems quite different and strangely does not work at all. Nice to see their efforts.

If you watch *Doctor Who and the Silurians* with the episode selection, at the end of the seventh episode, a full colour trailer of *The Ambassadors of Death*, the following story, will play. This original, partially restored, trailer, draws you in expertly. Perhaps a future release will not be too long coming, despite the massive restoration work needed. The only annoyance does come from the fact that only using Episode selection, not Play All, reveals the trailer. Really both styles should be accommodated.

For a mini-feature called Firsts, play *The Time Warrior*; simply press left while on the Special Feature link on the Main Menu. While nothing elaborate, it's a nice boast to everything new, although they do start stretching it somewhat towards the end. A second, more realistic egg resides on the second of the Special Features menu; to reach it just press left while on the Back option. Terrance Dicks will briefly speak about a photo and for the image alone its worth a look. The brief monologue summaries the production attitude to the era rather nicely.

On *Planet of Evil* an extra called Hidden Hinchcliffe will be revealed by pressing left while on Continuities. This fascinating feature lasts over ten minutes and would bore the socks off many a newbie, but for a hardened fan there feels no drag. The "juicier" bits of this interview appeared in the main documentary, so think of this as a treat. Its most relevant for anyone who likes archived records and opinions.

For the first of two promotion videos on the Blackpool Exhibition, press left on the Tom Baker interview on *The Ark in Space*. The second follows the conclusion of the last episode, so just let the credits play. Both advertisements fly past, though the humour draws you into them immediately. Love the strange moment in the second egg when Tom falls off the screen.

On *The Hand of Fear*, from the Play All option, press left, right, then left to reveal a Nationwide interview with Liz Sladen. While the short interview does feel as fluffy as the image is fuzzy, it's nice seeing Liz out of her character, even though a massive Dalek hovers over her. She talks briefly, mostly forgettable, but the Dalek's plans of extermination draw attention.

If you have the re-released *The Armageddon Factor*, press right from Continuities and a breakdown with the original transmission of Episode Five will be glimpsed. This may sound pointless, it may well be, but the music they played over the "Temporary fault" has rather a nice beat to it and I felt a mild pang of disappointment when the episode resumed. Strangely, I feel a sense of resolution with this as I always wondered why the "Temporary fault" message appeared on the Key to Time trailers. Now I know.

Silly but harmless eggs on *City of Death* all live on disc two. You can view the MkIII Jagaroth Battlecruiser Instruction Booklet by simply pressing left from Paris in the Springtime. For sheer randomness alone, it is worth a look; love how the Mark I was a failure due to collapsing on take-off! Now for a feature that deserves to be more than an egg. An interview with Douglas Adams regarding a drunken incident with director Ken Grieve will be enjoyed by pressing left on Prehistoric Landscapes. This probably should have been a standard extra due to Adams' input alone. Press left from Photo Library. It simply shows a out-take from *Eye On Blanchford*. Finally, a fourth egg hatches by cracking the remote left from Doctor Who Annual to reveal an ultra-short, yet quirky sketch with Tom Baker and John Cleese.

For the best "Easter Egg Ever"(tm) look no further than the 25th Anniversary Edition of *The Five Doctors*. On the first disc, the televised version, go to the Companions' Commentary and press right. You shall be treated to an audio commentary by Phil Collinson, Helen Raynor, and David Tennant. Hearing our new series participants talking as fans truly feels wonderful, which makes this commentary the most enjoyable one thus far – and it's hidden away like this... for shame! Hilarious for all the right reasons. Watch now!

Now for an easy one, watch *The Keeper Of Traken* until the end and a short clip of Anthony Ainley will be worth the wait. It's only a brief moment, so do not make an effort for this one. Still, the dedication they added feels as though it were meant. Strange clip to chose, but it came from the 1997 *Destiny of the Doctors* computer game. Possibly the last footage of Ainley.

I can see why people may think "why bother", but this hidden feature reveals what Easter Eggs should be. Press left on the Audio Options while on the *Castrovalva* disc. You will see Peter Davison on a parade float with some monsters. Does it add anything? No. Would you miss out by not seeing it? Not at all. Will it give you a smile when you find it? Most certainly. I think the float monsters were mostly fan built, but the Doctor seems real enough.

Earthshock 'tis a silly place, to prove it you select the 40th Anniversary Celebration option then press left, you can laugh at an over-dubbed portion of Earthshock. The only issue with this, and its the source material so there is no alternative, but the audience laughter makes it impossible to hear the dubbing – rendering the sketch meaningless. Still, you should get enough out of it to laugh at the situation – if not for the voices.

For Warriors of the Deep extras, look no further than Mat's Models, hidden until you surface them by pressing left on Science in Action. The usual wit and comments that make Mat himself still come through the images of the models. If you usually like his extras, watch and enjoy. Probably not up to his usual standard, I can see why they hid this away, but the look at the models really shows the bits he managed to perfect, unlike the Mirka.

For a compilation of clips from secondary cast members re-recording dialog, be on the main menu of *Revelation of the Daleks* and press left while on Episode Selection. Not really sure of the point of this, but it's here to see so look. I guess seeing the actors after all these years can at least remind us of our own mortality and, wait, no maybe I am reading too much into this. They just popped this in to fill up an empty track on the disc, nothing more or less.

To hear an unexpurgated version of Gwendoline's song (and who wouldn't) in *Ghost Light*, press left while on Episode Selection. They may have just listed this as a deleted scene, but I guess it just did not make the cut again.

While on the second disc of *The Curse of Fenric*, highlight Recutting the Runes and press left. Mark Ayres shall talk regarding the re-scoring of the special edition. I usually do not take care for the musical extras, and this is no exception. Information wise, it does what it says on the tin.
